We're kicking off the new year with a new format for our monthly book club!

Each month, we will read from a different genre. On the first of the month, a survey with four titles will be posted on our website under the "Adult" tab or by following this link: https://www.farmvillelibrary.org/book-club.html. Each book cover is linked to a summary on BookBrowse to help you pick your favorite. There will also be in-person voting during our regular book club meeting: **the 4th Thursday of the month at 6:30pm.** We hope that anyone who has considered joining a book club will vote when their favorite genre appears!

We will pick the book two months in advance. In November, we voted for January's book. January's genre is mysteries! The survey winner is . . . **book title**. Short summary.

In the coming months, our featured genres are: February - Romance

March - Nonfiction April - Historical Fiction

May - Fantasy/Sci-Fi

If we get enough people interested in reading a specific genre, we are open to starting a second book club (ex: historical fiction book club). Storytimes

Babies to Twos Wednesdays AND Thursdays at 10 am
